ENVIRONMENTAL: Larry Sims reported the following permits were issued in March:

2 Cabins, 3 RV Ports, 3 Carports, 3 sheds, 3 Decks, 1 bury power cable

Larry Sims reiterated to everyone that permit applications need to be turned in and a permit issued before any construction begins. Also, permits need to be posted where they are visible from the road. If any PC member sees new construction but no visible permit, they should contact either Colton or Larry. Also, PC members can go to the office and inquire if a lot owner has a permit or not.

NATURAL RESOURCES: Bruce Studley reported that 139 trees were approved to be removed from 40 lots in March. but a substantial number of the 139 trees were already dead.

A petting zoo will be set up, probably at the ball fields at Entrance.

Amy Oliver mentioned that there is a bubble truck that may be of interest.

Two volunteers are still needed for pool security from 6 pm - 10 pm on Saturday. The BOD will be asked to post this on social media.

Cristy Herron motioned to approve. Kim Wyman seconded. Passed

Old Business: Updated Natural Resources Charter was voted on and accepted by PC.

The BOD is working to develop a program for the Sugar Maples.

Cristy Herron motioned to approve. Kathy Sims seconded. Passed

New Business:

Encroachment guidelines – PC voted this document should be stricken from the records as parts of it are in direct contradiction to Rules & Regulations, Covenants and/or By-Laws.

WCCC Updates – WCCC will plant flowers at the marquee and guard shack. They will stock fish into a couple of lakes. They will be serving breakfast on Saturday of Memorial Day weekend and possibly Sunday. Chuck to check into free saplings from the Missouri Dept. of Conservation.

Lot owner presented her appeal of a violation she received for placing a TV at the dumpsters. She says she placed it outside of the dumpster because it was a working TV and she thought someone else could benefit from it. She said that's what has been done in the past. She was also disputing the amount of the fine (\$100) because the sign at the dumpsters says the fine is \$50. After discussion, all but two PC members voted that the fine should stand, but it should be reduced down to \$50 because that's what the sign read. The other two PC members thought it should stand at \$100.

A lot owner mentioned that the BOD Minutes are not up to date on the official Wildwood web site. The approval process and subsequent delay in posting minutes was explained.

A lot owner asked if the "Adopt a Lot" program is still in effect because it is still in the Rules & Regulations. This program has been replaced by the adjoining lot discount program and the Rules & Regulations need to be updated accordingly.

Debby Johnson asked about lot signage as there are several signs now on lots. The Rules & Regulations and Bylaws and Covenants prohibit signs, however, that is unenforceable by law. In order to remove them from the Bylaws and Covenants, it requires lot owner vote.

Bill Tisher motioned to Adjourn. Cristy Herron seconded. Motion passed and PC meeting adjourned at 9:55 am.
