

WLOA SHOOTING RANGE RULES

1. To use the range you must be a member of WLOA or an authorized guest.
2. All shooters must sign in on Rifle Range Log Book maintained at the WLOA Office or with WLOA Security prior to shooting.
3. Shooting hours are from 10:00 am to sundown.
4. Anyone under the age of eighteen (18) years must be accompanied by a responsible adult member.
5. Shooting range users are responsible for their own safety and actions while using the range.
6. All persons are required to immediately report any and all unsafe conditions or safety infractions to the WLOA Office or WLOA Security.
7. Possession of alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs are prohibited on all ranges and associated parking lots. **No warning and an automatic \$250.00 fine will be assessed for violations.**
8. Anyone unruly or suspected of being under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be immediately expelled from the range.
9. Only paper targets will be used. No metal or exploding targets, tin cans, bottles, etc. will be allowed. No human outlines.
10. No target shall be attached to target support post.
11. No targets shall be attached to "Turkey Shoot" shelter.
12. Intentional shooting of Target Support post or Turkey Shoot shelter may result in suspension of range use privileges and may subject violator(s) to WLOA imposed fines.
13. No shooting at Wildlife at ANY time.
14. All firearms and ammunition may be subject to inspection at any time.
15. No "quick draws", "shooting from the hip", or "rapid firing" will be will be allowed. All shots must be spaced.
16. Anyone discharging a firearm in an unsafe direction or manner will be expelled from the range.
17. Handling a firearm in an unsafe manner: 1st offense – person will be cautioned. 2nd offense – person will be expelled from the range.
18. All injuries must be reported immediately to the Office or Security.
19. All firearms must be unloaded with an open breach when not on firing line. Firearms will be loaded only when on the firing line. All firearms will be unloaded before leaving firing lines.
